



Western Seminary & Mercy and Grace Ministries **GET CERTIFIED: Ministry Foundations**

Overview: With courses specially selected from Western Seminary's Theological Studies, Biblical Studies, and Elder Training Tracks in their Center for Leadership Development—this training partnership is intended to equip servant-disciples to build up the saved and evangelize the lost within jails and prisons or in other mission fields.

Total training and instruction for this certificate is 32 hours over 5 months, including Mercy and Grace 101 and 201 training (a total of 6 hours of training in 3 class sessions). As the four Western course modules are being completed, Mercy and Grace 101 and 201 should also be completed.

Students will watch 4 Western Seminary courses (from 3.5 to 5.5 hours each—total of 18 hours), review the study guides, and complete quizzes. After Western classes, students will assemble to review the material and apply it to personal spiritual growth, effective evangelism to the lost, and practical ministry to Christians.

Those review and application sessions will be combined with M&G training on the S.E.E.D. Model: Sanctification, Equipping, Empowerment, and Deployment. Total S.E.E.D. Model Instruction + Application Review Sessions are 8 hours total. The course completion celebration is one hour on 6/2/2018.

Cost: \$200. Installment payments can be arranged. Scholarships are available based upon need. Contact Eric Mueller to inquire about scholarships: eric@mercyandgrace.org.

Process:

- 1. Pay the course fee to Mercy and Grace of \$200.
- 2. Attend first course preview/instruction session (2 hours) on 1/6/2018.
- 3. You will receive instructions to register on-line for the Western Seminary courses. Watch each course in order, review its study guide, and take the quiz for each of the four courses on your own. This is self-paced but each one must be completed before the review session for group development and ministry application after Western courses.
- 4. Attend all of the Mercy & Grace application and S.E.E.D Model training sessions (make-up classes or recordings will be made available for those who cannot attend in person).
- 5. Complete Mercy and Grace 101 and 201 trainings (you do not have to take these trainings again if you have already completed them but you may do so as a refresher).
- 6. Attend final application & S.E.E.D Model session + completion ceremony (3 hours) on 6/2/2018.
